These are the main topics of our youth exchange:

- ▶ **1) Intercultural learning** → because we will be staying together with people from other countries and we want to use the chance to learn as much as possible, become more open and respectful.
- ▶ **2) Sustainability** → because we will be staying at our beautiful campsite and we want to use the chance to make you more aware about nature around us and the importance of protecting it.
- ▶ **3) Active citizenship** → because we don't want you to keep what you learn only to yourself, but to share it in your community and influence others.

What can you expect?

- ▶ You will stay together with people from different countries and learn about their cultures in depth, to work together and respect each other's differences.
- ▶ You will take up the challenge to spend your days outdoors at the campsite. Learn to be more eco-friendly and understand more about environmental protection. You will try to cook on a stove, start a fire, swim in the river, use a canoe... You will step out of your comfort zone and have fun doing it.
- ▶ You will prepare an activity for others - try to step into the role of a leader.
- ▶ You will discuss various topics with others... especially those that the group will find interesting and want to speak up about.
- ▶ You will become more aware of your learning process, learn to set up goals for yourself and reflect on your achievements.
- ▶ You will experience non-formal education - learning by doing and by playing.

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In a youth exchange, a lot is up to you!

- ▶ You will define your own learning goals and we will help you reach them.
- ▶ You will have the space to address topics you are interested in.
- ▶ You will have the chance to propose activities you would like to do.
- ▶ There is a lot you can learn - from the campsite, from the group, from the leaders. Remember, the responsibility for doing that is up to you!



Profile of participants:

- ▶ Age 18-30 + group leader 18+
- ▶ Able to communicate in English - But you don't need to be perfect! The important thing is to try your best 😊
- ▶ Ready and motivated to actively participate in all the project activities (preparation, youth exchange, sharing the results)
- ▶ Interested in the topics of the project - learning about other cultures, practicing soft skills, outdoor skills, environment, active citizenship

Accommodation:

- ▶ We will be staying in an attractive touristic location on a bank of the river Lužnice. In the morning you can enjoy the beautiful view of the river covered in mist and at night you can watch the sky full of stars. We will be quite far from civilization, which is a wonderful opportunity to have a rest from everyday life.
- ▶ We will be accommodated in four cottages and share three bathrooms. Our experienced cook will provide you with good food according to your taste and wishes.
- ▶ We like our camp and its surroundings very much and so we will teach you how to keep it clean and nice. We will show you how to sort the waste and how to put dirty dishes into the washing machine, so that we leave the place as beautiful as we found it.

To have a comfortable stay, you should bring:

- ▶ A warm sleeping bag
- ▶ A towel
- ▶ Outdoor shoes - ideally waterproof for wet grass
- ▶ A waterproof jacket
- ▶ Slippers to wear in the cottages
- ▶ A torch
- ▶ A water bottle
- ▶ Swimsuit, if you want to swim in the river

- ▶ On one of the days, we will do a hiking trip from Tábor back to the campsite (ca. 14 km). For that, it is important to have shoes suitable for walking, a waterproof jacket and a small backpack.

- ▶ If you are missing any of these things or they don't fit into your baggage, let us know and we will do our best to help you. 😊





Youthpass



- ▶ At the end of the training course, you will receive a Youthpass certificate. Youthpass is an EU tool for recognition of non-formal learning activities, such as Erasmus+ projects.
- ▶ You can use your Youthpass for example when you apply for university or for a job. It will prove that you developed your competences in an international project, improved your English and became more thoughtful about your own learning. 😊

Travel arrangements:

- ▶ ARRIVAL DAY: **10th June**
- ▶ DEPARTURE DAY: **22nd June**
- ▶ When your participation is confirmed by us, please, look for suitable tickets to Tábor and send them to us for approval.
- ▶ PLEASE, DON'T BUY ANY TICKETS WITHOUT CONFIRMATION FROM OUR SIDE. OTHERWISE, WE WILL NOT PAY YOU THE REIMBURSEMENT.
- ▶ IT IS OBLIGATORY FOR EACH PARTICIPANT TO OBTAIN **TRAVEL INSURANCE**.

Travel tips:

- ▶ The money for travel will be reimbursed to you up to a limit (see previous page) at the end of the youth exchange.
- ▶ When booking the tickets, please consider that the transport in Czech Republic will also cost some money. Please, try to find the cheapest tickets possible.
- ▶ If you use any physical tickets during your journey, we can only reimburse them if we get them from you physically – a picture is not enough, you need to give them to us in person or send them by post.
- ▶ Please, keep the environment in mind and try to find the „greenest“ way of travel.

Travel tips:

- ▶ The best way to get to Tábor from Prague is by train – trains to Tábor go from the main train station in Prague in quite short intervals - ca. every hour. Our hotel is located 750 m. from the train station in Tábor, so no public transportation is probably needed.
- ▶ To get to the Prague main train station from the airport, use the airport buses. They stop right in front of the terminals.
- ▶ When travelling in the Czech Republic by train, keep in mind that:
 - ▶ It is much cheaper to buy the train ticket for the whole group together than separately.
 - ▶ Students only pay 50% of the full price, but you need to have your ISIC card with you.

Green travel:

- ▶ We are offering the option of „green travel“. Your travel budget (see the table on previous page) can be higher if you use a „green means of travel“.
- ▶ „Green means of travel“ is pretty much everything but flying and driving a car alone. It covers: train, bus, carsharing, bike and any other low-emission means of transport.
- ▶ In order to receive the „green travel“ budget, you have to use green means of transport for the main part of your journey – so if you take your car to drive 10 km to the train station, it is not a problem.
